

Nature park "Daugavas loki"

River Daugava Bends (loki) is a Nature Park in River Daugava valley between Kraslava and Naujene in Augšdaugavas Protected Landscape Area. The territory of the park is 129.9 km², 76 km² of which are located in Daugavpils and 53.9 km² in Kraslava's region. It had been founded in 1990 to preserve the unique and peculiar River Daugava valley landscape, its valuable natural complexes, its biodiversity of plant and animal species, as well as its cultural-historic monuments. The most characteristic natural feature of "Daugavas loki" is 9 big River Daugava Bends (meanders) between Kraslava and Naujene. Each of the river bends length reaches up to 4 - 6 km, but the distance between the bends on the straightaway is only 2 - 3 km. Each of the bends has its own name. In 2011, it was included in the Latvian National List of the UNESCO World Heritage.
